### Other news

#### Young people and vaping

Vaping is not for children and young people. Their developing lungs and brains mean they are more sensitive to its effects. Nicotine vaping is substantially less harmful than smoking, but it is not risk-free. That's why there's a minimum age of sale for vaping products in the UK and it is illegal to sell nicotine vaping products to anyone under 18 or for adults to buy them on behalf of under-18s.

In some instances, vaping from a young age can lead to young people moving onto more addictive products as they get older.

If you're aware of a retailer selling either nicotine vapes or tobacco products to under-18s, you can report them to the council by emailing <a href="mailto:tradingstandards@lbbd.gov.uk">tradingstandards@lbbd.gov.uk</a> or via the Citizens Advice online portal.

In Barking and Dagenham, the council runs a Responsible Retailer Scheme for the selling of vapes where it encourage local businesses to sign up and agree to sell vapes responsibly. This means not selling them to young people under 18, checking IDs and making sure that they aren't selling illegal vapes. The council regularly runs test purchasing operations to ensure businesses are following the rules and selling vapes responsibly.

Online: Report a crime online.


