

GUIDELINES FOR CHOOSING YOUR OPTIONS

- ALL students will study a minimum of 3 A Levels, one subject should be chosen from 3 of blocks A, B, C and D.
- You can mix A Levels with BTEC courses. e.g. Level 3 BTEC Business Diploma (Block A and B) (worth
 2 A Levels) with another A Level subject from either Block C or Block D.
- You may decide to do a BTEC Extended Diploma worth 3 A Levels, for example, in Sport or Business.

As a very successful department we aim to help pupils make progress from KS4 and to equip them with the creative and academic rigour necessary to be successful at 'A' level and in their future choices and careers. Pupils will learn to find their creative identity as they work with like-minded pupils in a thriving studio environment. They will become proficient in a wide variety of media. The skills learnt will be those required by further education and employers; discipline, perseverance, creative thinking and self-belief.

In Year 12, pupils will build upon a foundation of practical skills and academic study to help them to independently develop their own personal investigation which will constitute their coursework for 'A' level. The personal investigation reflects the individual passions, skills and interests of each pupil as they are taught how they design their own project which meets all of the assessment objectives. With the project constituting 60% of your mark as coursework, the skills in planning and designing a unit of work will then be applied to the theme you choose to from the exam paper given in Year 13.

We aim for students to develop enthusiasm, passion and genuine curiosity for Business. By examining small and large businesses, students develop a critical understanding of organisations and their ability to meet society's needs and wants. Whether students' progress to studying Business at Higher Education or not, they gain life skills and develop transferable employability skills. They will be able to understand current affairs with more clarity and confidence, as they have studied business behaviour from a range of stakeholder perspectives, but also examined the influence of the PESTLE factors, in an abundance of situations. This has allowed students to generate enterprising and creative approaches to business opportunities, problems and issues. Our young learners will be aware of the ethical dilemmas and responsibilities faced by organisations and individuals, as social trends are prominent throughout Business. 


