




### Let's find out about you ...







# Most frequently asked questions when joining Barking Abbey

How many lessons do I have each day?	You have 5 lessons each day, 60 minutes in length.
How many subjects do I study?	14 subjects, usually with different teachers for each subject.
Are we placed in sets?	You are in mixed ability groups
How many breaks do we have in a day?	You have a 20-minute break and a 40-minute lunch.
Can we leave the school grounds at lunchtime?	No pupil leaves the school grounds until the end of the school day.
What is a form tutor?	This is a teacher you meet every day, who takes morning registration, discusses your progress and helps you set targets.
What are achievement points?	They are rewarded for excellence in class work, homework, attitude, effort and recorded on your school record by your teachers. The more points the more rewards.
How many forms groups are there?	There are 6 form groups in year 7 and you will find out which form you are in by September.
Can I chew gum?	Chewing gum is not allowed at the school.
When can I join clubs?	Most clubs are advertised to you in September for you to join.
Who do I speak to if I have a problem?	You have a form tutor, Head of Year and subject teachers who look after you.

Can I wear trainers or plimsolls?	Just black shoes unless you have a note from your parents.
How long will I spend doing KS3?	You spend Year 7, Year 8, Year 9 doing KS3 and start KS4 in Year 10.
What times do reflections run?	Reflection time is when you reflect on your behaviour, usually last 20 minutes at lunchtime, after school though can be kept longer if the teacher requires.
Are mobile phones allowed?	We recommend you keep at home. All phones switched off.

Can I use the school internet?	Your internet account will be activated once you and you parents have signed the school internet agreement when you arrive in September.
What time is the school building open in the morning?	8am including the canteen.
Are hooded tops allowed to be worn?	No
When do I get a school report to check my progress?	You receive a school report at the end of each term, three reports each year.
When do I get my timetable?	The first day when you start in September.
